List of Exchange Visitor Programs in "G" and "P" Categories

NOTICE

SUBJECT: Public Law 91-225, enacted April 7, 1970

Upon review and consultation with Program sponsors, the International Communication Agency has determined that participation in the following Exchange Visitor Programs constitutes financing directly or indirectly by the Government of the United States:

1. All programs bearing a "G" number designation are considered to be "governmentally financed within the meaning of PL 91-225" except for those programs listed below. These programs do not have government financing except the programs listed with an asterisk which sponsor some participants who are governmentally funded and others who are not so funded. In a case where an asterisk appears the program sponsor will have to be consulted to determine if government funds were involved.

Participants who came to the United States on or after May 25, 1972 may be subject to the provisions of Section 212(e) of the Immigration and Nationality Act by virtue of the "Skills List."

A continuing review of all Programs bearing a "P" number designation may result in other additions to this list. From time to time, certain "P" Program Sponsors will receive a special grant from a foreign government or a United States Government agency for the specific purpose of furthering international exchange. Exchange Visitors who are the recipients of such grant benefits are considered to be "governmentally financed" within the meaning of PL 91-225.

An exchange visitor who has been the recipient of a "Fulbright Grant," including travel only, is considered as having been financed directly by an agency of the United States

Government regardless of whether he participated in a Program having a "G" or "P" number designation.
